<b>○授業の到達目標及びテーマ</b> This course aims to help students better understand interstate relations in East Asia, from a variety of issues angles including history, society, politics, economy and etc.			
<b>○授業の概要</b> This course helps students better understand interstate relations in East Asia, by analyzing its political, economic, security and social issues from an array of IR theories. Also, students are expected to cultivate research questions, and actively apply theoretical knowledge to empirical analysis. Specifically, students play a central part in class discussions over case studies. Through discussions with classmates and the lecturer, students are to find different perspectives on issues and deepen their understanding in interstate relations in East Asia.			
<b>○授業の方法</b> 1) In order to meaningfully participate in class discussions, students have to read assigned readings before attending each class. Reading materials will be distributed to the class at the beginning of the semester. 2) Students will have to submit two academic papers. Before submission, students are also required to make a presentation based on their papers so that they can reflect feedbacks from other classmates and the lecturer in their final submissions. 3) The first paper will be approximately 1,000 words and the second 3,000 words.
