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### ○Course Objectives

This course aims to provide basic knowledge, concepts, and theoretical frameworks for understanding international mediation. Students are expected to be familiar with peacemaking efforts by the international society and acquire analytical skills for considering these issues.

### ○Course Summary

The first two lectures will review various forms of conflict management tools such as negotiation, mediation, arbitration and adjudication, peace operations, sanction, and military intervention. The rest of the part will focus on mediation.

Lectures will be given in English. Students are expected to prepare for each class by reading assigned texts and be ready to participate actively. Also, relevant film and video materials will be used, followed by a brief discussion or a reaction paper.
